



Drillers Assistants support drilling operations by performing required duties to promote a continuous work flow and maintain equipment.

Drilling Assistant duties:

Dig and back-fill trenches by hand

Deliver materials to job sites

Locate Utilities

Tracking for driller

Handle and fuse pipe

Change drill bits and tools

Assist in the routine maintenance and lubrication of rig equipment and trucks

Assist in the inspection of all equipment

Drillers Assistant should have an eye for detail and good communication skills.

Able to lift 50 pounds on a regular basis

Drive support vehicles

Be responsive to instructions

Be willing to learn how to fuse pipe, mix and manage drilling fluids, and use the tracking system

Able to communicate effectively

Be responsive to instructions

Work as a team



The Directional Driller must have the understanding of directional boring principals.

Directional Drill Operator

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILTIES:

2 years previous experience working as a directional drilling employee

2 years' experience using Tracker/Locator

2 years' experience operating a direction drill

Inspect work sites and ensure daily activities are performed as instructed by immediate supervisor.

REQUIREMENTS:

Must have a minimum of 2 years experience working with underground utilities

Must be able to communicate with others to convey information effectively.

Must be accustomed to working outdoors with exposure to all weather conditions

Must be able to perform physical activities that require considerable use of your arms and legs and moving your whole body, such as climbing, lifting 50 pounds on a regular basis, balancing, walking, stooping, and handling of materials

- Must demonstrate attention to detail
 - Must be knowledgeable of safety procedures and practices
 - Ability to travel in the New England Area is required, if necessary
 - Must have valid CDL license
 - Must complete and pass a pre-employment drug & alcohol screen

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
